

There have been MANY requests for the recipe for Hot Chicken Salad from the UMW luncheon, so, here it is!

Hot Chicken Salad

4 cups chicken, cut into pieces (Boil chicken in celery and a clove of garlic, don't use too much water, cool chicken in stock)

1.5 cups celery, cut fine

2 pimentos, chopped

4 hard boiled eggs, chopped

1 Tbsp onion juice or 1/4 onion, finely minced

2 Tbsp lemon juice

1.5 cups Mayonnaise, Hellman's

2/3 cup almonds, blanched and sliverd

Salt to taste

Mix all ingredients together, put in not too shallow baking dish. Let stand several hours (even overnight). Crush 2 cups potato chips and 1.5 cups sharp cheddar cheese. Mix together and sprinkle on top just before baking. Bake 25 minutes at 350 degrees.

This recipe was doubled for the luncheon at the Methodist Church.

(cont. from pg. 1) you can expect, it would happen again and again as I had little hope of standing against the power of the waves.

Another memory is of my father. One of his favorite things to do in the ocean would be best described as body surfing. He would go into the ocean until he reached the point where the waves were reaching their peak swell. At the right moment he would thrust his body just in front of a wave. If he caught it just right he could ride the wave all the way to shore. The look of exhilaration on his face afterward told me that it had been a fantastic ride! He tried often to help me learn how to ride the wave, but I never seemed to be as good at it as he was. I seemed to be more adept at getting knocked down by waves.

In a way, my memories of the beach remind me of our life as the Church. Sometimes we resemble those who are determined to stand against the waves, often getting knocked right off our feet. At other times we favor the wave riders, looking for the force in motion and positioning ourselves to be caught up in its power. If we believe that God is active in the world (and I believe that He is) we should be less like the wave resistors and more like the wave riders. We have to decide whether we want to join God's movement or try to resist it.

I have heard it said that the Church should stop praying for God to bless what we are doing and start praying that God would help us do the things that He is blessing. There is certainly wisdom in that counsel. My suspicion, though, is that we tend to pray the former rather than the latter. Remember, we serve a God who is known to do new things, to move in directions completely unexpected. Easter and the subsequent birth of the Church is one of the greatest examples of this. When the Church was getting its start, the non-believing Jews strongly opposed the first apostles. At that time a Pharisee named Gamaliel offered some wise words in regard to the early Christian movement: "If this plan or this undertaking is of man, it will fail; but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them. You might even be found opposing God!" (Acts 5:38b-39). Gamaliel understood that if those early Christ followers had caught a wave of God, nothing would stop them.

The apostle Paul said, "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). This is the heart of a wave rider, one who is totally committed to follow wherever the Spirit leads. May that same commitment be found in us, that we would be free to catch the wave of God's Spirit moving among us.
