(cont. from pg. 1) the land of Midian. As he would eventually discover, not every day of tending flocks is the same as the rest. God had chosen to act on behalf of the Hebrew people, and Moses would be God's agent of freedom. I don't know about you, but the last thing I expect in a day is to encounter an angel of the Lord in a burning bush. When God showed up, Moses' life would never be the same. Surprise!

Then there was Saul, the "Hebrew of Hebrews" who surpassed others of his time in his zeal for God. Could there have been someone who was more convinced that his religious thinking and practice was correct? What a surprise he had when Jesus met him along the road. It was so overwhelming that Paul apparently had to go off by himself to "let it sink in" (see Galatians 1:15-17). Imagine the converted Paul saying to God, "I didn't realize I could have made such a big mistake about what you are doing." Surprise!

And how could we omit Mary? Her story hardly needs comment. This young maiden anticipated what most of us would describe as an unremarkable life. Then God showed up, and her life forever changed. She would be known through the century as the one chosen to bear the Son of God. Surprise!

There are many other accounts in scripture of God working in unexpected, powerful, head-scratching, even humorous ways. We could add Balaam's donkey, Jonah's fish, Abraham's promise, Peter's prison break; the list goes on and on. You just never know how God will choose to surprise us next.

One of our general miscalculations as followers of Jesus is that we lose our expectation of God's surprises. You might say that we subconsciously domesticate God, limiting our vision of God's action in the world to the ordinary rather than the extraordinary. We lose the sense of divine surprise, being able to expect—and embrace—the unexpected. The God we serve is a God on the move, always doing things that have the capacity to surprise us. Though we can't anticipate all that God will do, we can be sure that God will continue to surprise us, and those surprises have the potential to knock us off our feet if we are not ready for God to do a "new thing."

Awesome God, we your people stand ready. Surprise us!
