
Loving All the Children

UMCOR Health Kit

The United Methodist Women conduct a hands-on project each year to benefit UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief), and this year will be collecting items to make health kits. Health kits provide basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disaster. Health kits are also used as learning tools in personal hygiene, literacy, nutrition, and cooking classes. Once all items are collected, they will be sent to the Sager Brown Depot (location of the youth mission trip).

- 1 Hand Towel (15 x 25" to 17x27") Kitchen, cleaning, microfiber NOT acceptable
- 1 Washcloth
- 1 Toothbrush (adult size only) MUST be in original packaging
- 6 Adhesive bandages (3/4-1" in size) Common household band aids
- 1 Bath-size soap (3 oz. and larger sizes only) NO Ivory or Jergens due to moisture content MUST be in original packaging
- 1 Comb (sturdy and longer than 6") NO pocket or picks, Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable with a minimum of 6" of teeth
- 1 Metal Nail File or Nail Clippers, NO emery boards
- 1 Plastic Bag (One gallon size, sealable bag only)
- 1 dollar bill to purchase toothpaste

You may make donations of the items listed above and leave them in the church office and/or you may make monetary donations (please make check payable to UMW) which will be used to purchase these items. Each kit costs approximately \$12, and our goal is to provide 25 kits. All items and/or monetary donations must be made by August 27th. (cont. from pg. 1) for that. I believe that RMUMC is a body that loves the children, and I believe we can love them more.

I am confident that Jesus desired good for children in a holistic way. For us, part of loving the children will include support for their education. We can further strengthen the relationships we have with our local school administrators and teachers, seeking ways for us to compliment and support their work. Many children in our society are vulnerable because of various factors in their lives. This often results in poor performance in school. Those who love the children will find ways to offset those vulnerabilities so that the work of our schools is enhanced.

We need to continue working on ways to build bridges between our congregation and the families served by our day school. One thing we have learned so far is that this is more difficult than expected. Even so, we must continue "leaning into it." I commented during the message on Sunday that, even though a local congregation does serve the public, we are not a public service. We exist to help children and their parents become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ. In the words of Bishop Jones, "Children's ministry is often the doorway that allows us to do that."

Bishop Jones shared that in his experience many churches have said, "We don't have any children." His response: "Look around you!" There are children in the community, many of whom are not connected with a church, and all of whom could benefit from what we have to offer. In the words of a familiar hymn, we should ask God to "open our eyes, that I may see" the children who are right on our doorstep. They may be children whose families we do not know. Perhaps they just moved into our community. They may look different, and they may not know anything about the Christian faith. Still, they are beloved in God's sight. God sees them, and so should we.

Lastly, we must increasingly offer them ourselves. Greater children's ministry requires greater numbers of people working in children's ministry. We may have programs, but the most important thing that we can offer to children is not a program. It is ourselves. It is a loving, caring community of disciples who are willing to invest in them sacrificially. Remember, love is an action word. According to the example of Christ, let's strive to be a people who absolutely love *all* the children.
